- 4. For whose benefit is the headship of Christ always exercised? Compare Ephesians 1:22; 5:25-27.
- 5. For whose benefit should the headship of the husband be exercised? Note Ephesians 5:28.
- 6. Consider the ways that Christ loved the church and then apply them to the way a husband should love his wife.
