The ultimate question of life beyond Earth and the solar system takes center stage in a science conference led by the Vatican Observatory and a University of Arizona this week.

Nearly 200 scientists are attending the conference, called "The Search for Life Beyond the Solar System: Exoplanets, Biosignature & Instruments," which runs from March 16 through 21 in Tucson. The Vatican Observatory is co-hosting the conference with the University of Arizona's Steward Observatory.

Rev. Paul Gabor of the Vatican Observatory, the conference's... co-chair, [said] that scientists will give more than 160 research presentations during this week's conference.

According to the organizers, the conference will cover the technical challenges of finding and imaging exoplanets and identifying biosignatures in the atmospheres of far-flung worlds.

As of December 2012, the Habitable Exoplanets Catalog lists nine planets that have the best chance for life beyond our solar system. Not all of these planets are confirmed, and there's still a lot to learn about their environments. But the catalog gives astrobiologists a great place to start when talking about life beyond Earth.

The top candidate is Gliese 581G, about twenty light years away from our sun, and about three times as massive as the earth.
